STAGE 1 RESULTS

The survey shows widespread support for the 20mph speed limit, almost everyone using a Mussel Card and a majority view that existing transport services meet the needs of the Community. There is no majority in favour of promoting bicycles, a safety audit or more warning signs.

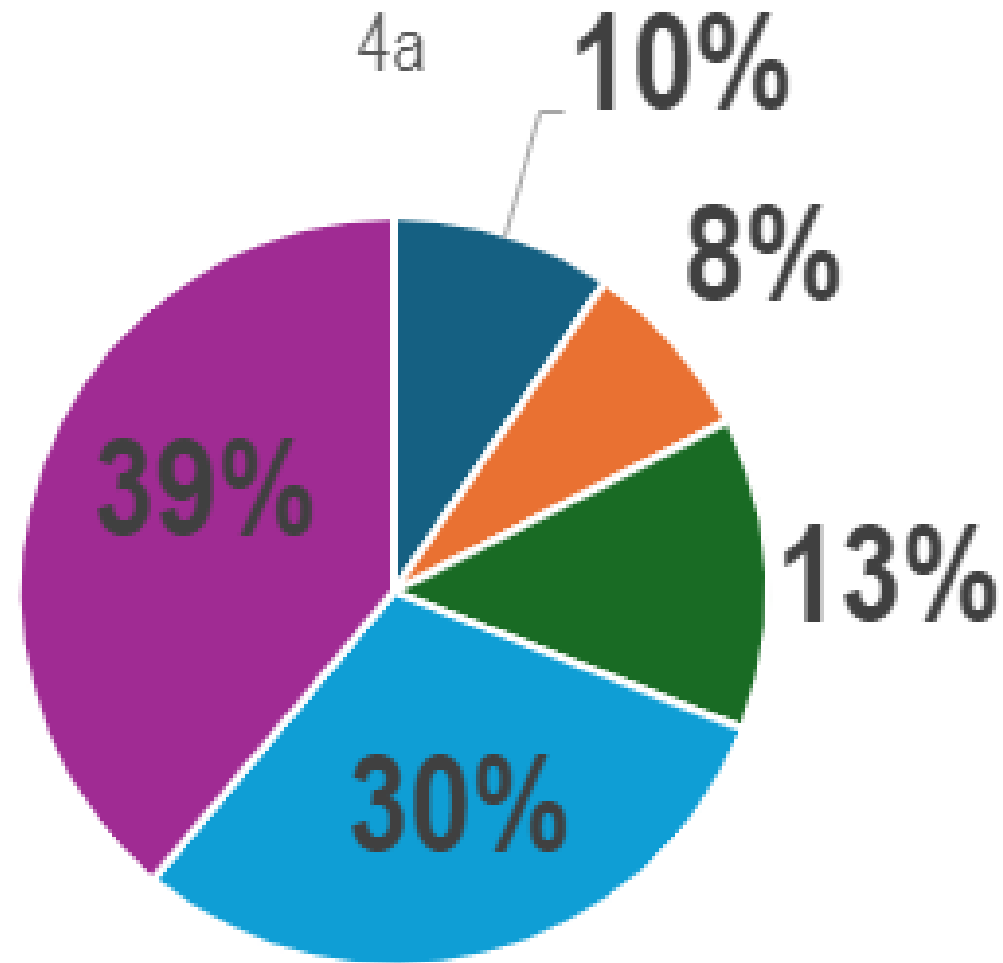

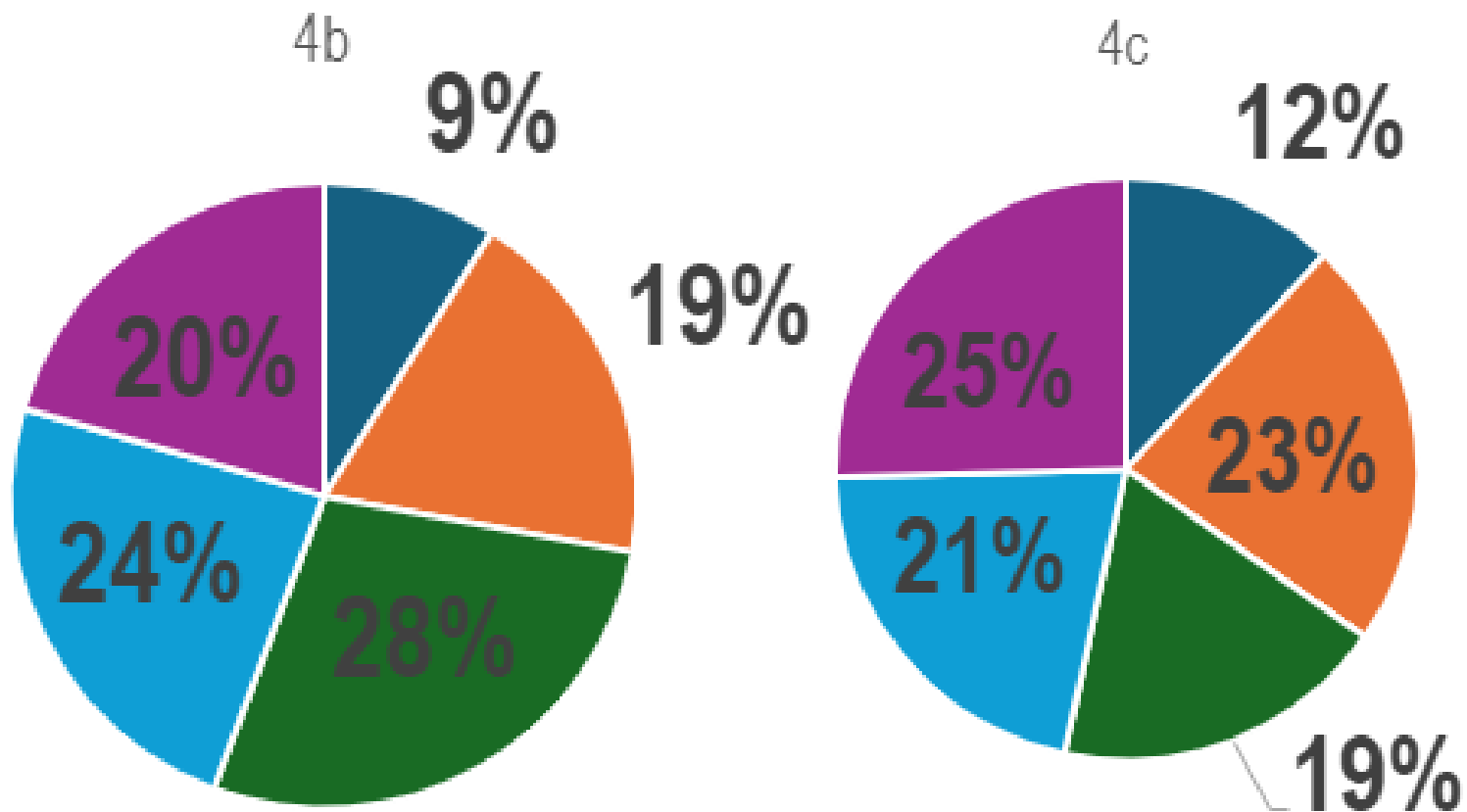
We asked: Do you support the new 20 mph limit?

You said:



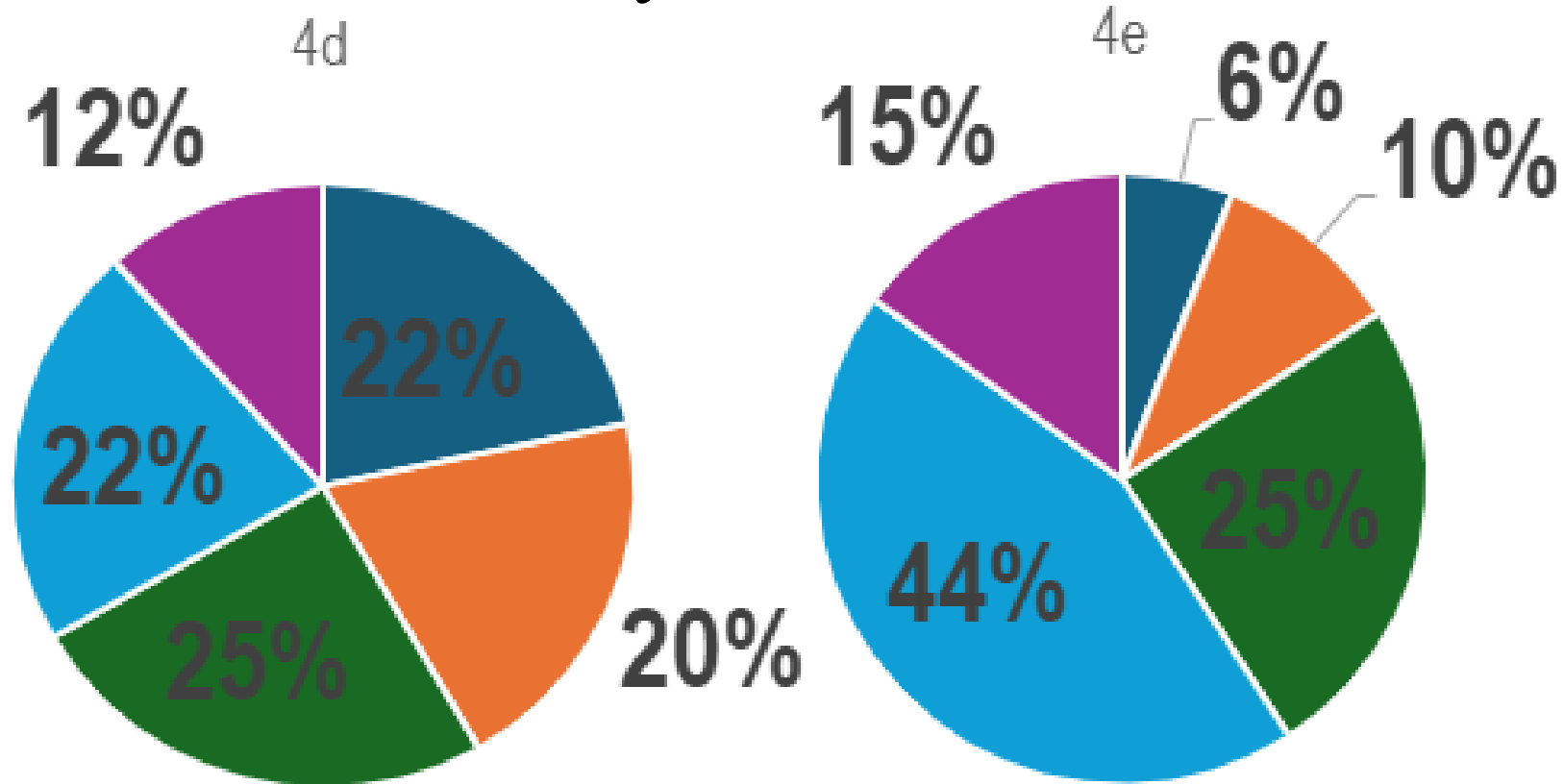
We asked: (4b) Should bicycle usage (esp with electric and hire bikes) be promoted?

(4c) Should a safety survey/audit be undertaken in the interests of both pedestrians and cyclists? You said:



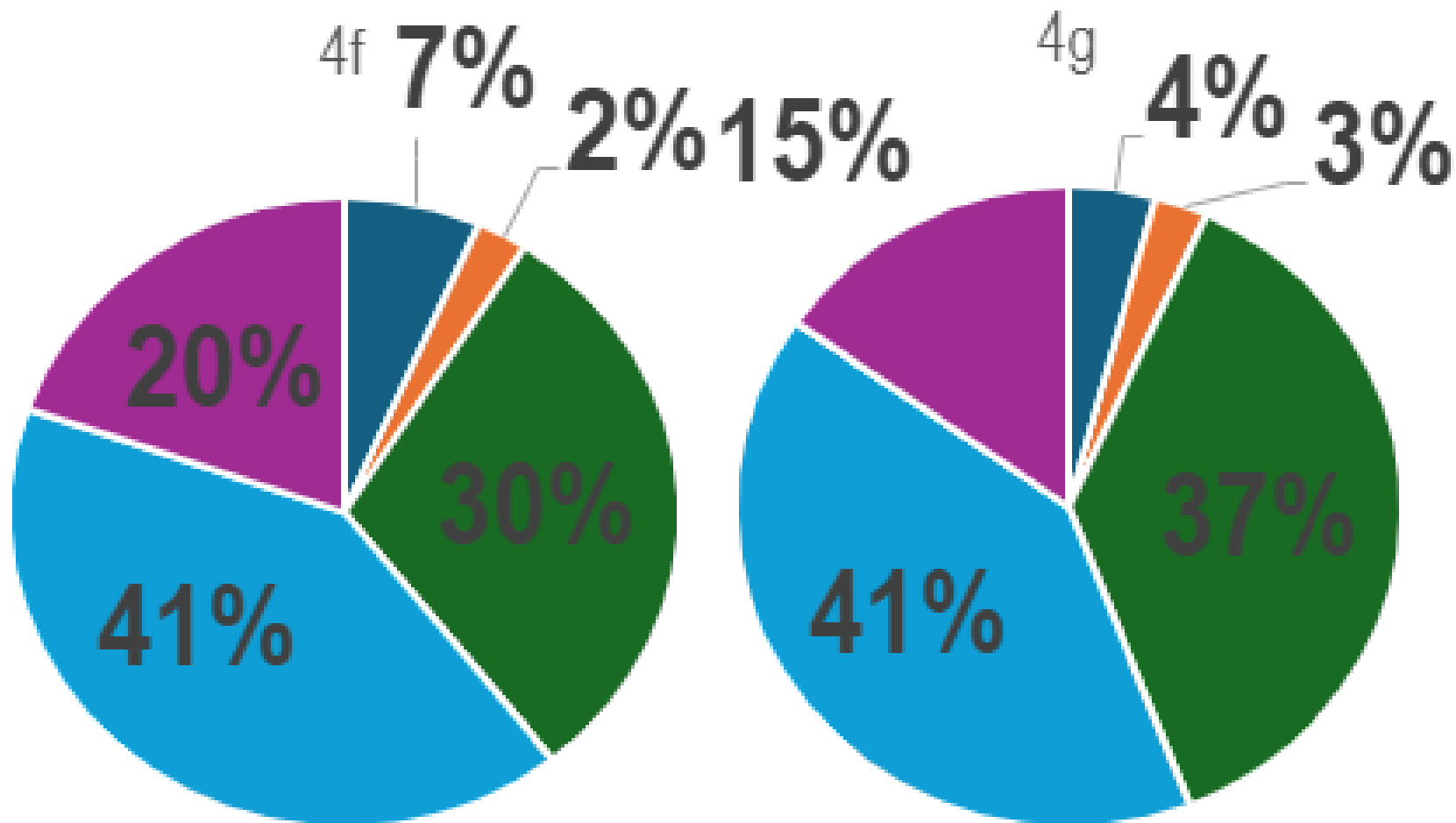
We asked: (4d) Given the dangerous nature of our roads, are more warning signs required?

STAGE 2

Bus Stops

Stage 1 gives a clear mandate for the Halwatha and St Just bus stops: this will be taken up with the relevant authorities.

Proposal 1 - Off road, traffic free cycle path St

Mawes - St Just

Following South West Water's work last year, we believe such a cycle path may be feasible. Would you support this?

Proposal 2 -Better footpath signage St Just-St Mawes

Recognised as one of the most beautiful walks in the county, unless you know it, this footpath is hard to follow. Do you support better signage?

Proposal 3 – Evening Minibus St Just - St Mawes
